Ethical considerations

In the work describing human experimentations, the authors should indicate whether the procedures used were in accordance with the ethical standards of the Human Experiments Committee (institutional or regional) or with the Declaration of Helsinki of 1975, amended in 2000. In case of doubt, whether the study was carried out in accordance with the Declaration of Helsinki, the authors must explain the rationale for their approach and demonstrate that the institutional audit authority explicitly approved the questionable aspects of the study. When reporting animal experiments, indicate whether the institution's or the National Research Council's recommendations or national regulations regarding the care and use of laboratory animals have been followed.

The Editorial Board of the "Farmacja Polska" magazine adopted and apply the principles of publication ethics in accordance with COPE (Publications Ethics Committee) guidelines.

Procedures to safeguard the authenticity of the publication

The Editorial Board actively fight all forms of scientific misconduct and disrespect for good manners in science (www.publicationethics.org):

- all co-authors should submit a written statement that the manuscript is original;
- all co-authors should disclose their contribution to the manuscript;
- the originality of the manuscript is assessed by two (2) independent reviewers, a language editor for abstracts and articles in English and an editor-in-chief;
- the manuscript is verified by an online plagiarism program to detect all forms of scientific misconduct;
- in case of suspicion of plagiarism or other scientific misconduct, the Editorial Board asks the first or last author of the manuscript for clarification, while suspending the preparation of the manuscript. The Editorial Board decides the final fate of the manuscript. The Editorial Board may notify the employer of suspected scientific offenses or may refer the matter for further clarification directly to the appropriate ethics committee. If a person outside the editorial team has reported suspected scientific abuse, he will be notified of the action taken. The fact that the manuscript has been published does not mean that no plagiarism or scientific offense has been committed.
